


Polling Station Activities

Provincial Elections



Scrutineers

- A candidate's agent may appoint a person (not necessarily an elector) to be a scrutineer:
 - for the purpose of observing voting procedures and/or the counting of the ballots.
- Scrutineers are not paid by the province and are not "election officers".

Candidates and Scrutineers at Polling Stations

- Candidates may visit any polling station for their election.
 - May enter the polling station.
 - May not campaign or obstruct voting inside.
 - May greet electors at entrance.
- One scrutineer per <u>polling division</u> for each candidate, per <u>polling</u> station.





Media at the Polling Station

- May record a candidate of a recognized party who is voting provided:
 - Returning Officer signs P 02 151/152 permission form;
 - The candidate has agreed;
 - No interviews are conducted in the polling station; and
 - The media representatives leave the polling station as soon as the candidate has cast their ballot.
